

Meeting with Senator Felipe Harboe

Steven Colon and Grace Martin (directors of FEDES Foundation) met with Senator Felipe Harboe (XIII Circumscription of Biobío) and his chief of staff, Deborah Bailey. The objective was to make progress in the delivery of humanitarian aid to the Region.

The XIII Region, with 2,127,902 inhabitants (population projected by INE in 2016) is the second largest in the country, and like the rest of the country, has major shortcomings with regards to the provision of public health. FEDES' work with other senators and deputies in the nation generated this senator's interest in our work, to look into bringing medical aid to his region, in terms of both supplies and equipment, for offices and hospitals.





Donation of Supplies and Orthotics to Sports and Social Clubs of the Municipality of San Bernardo

FEDES Foundation, together with representatives of the health department of the municipality of San Bernardo, delivered this donation. The collaboration agreement between the Municipality of San Bernardo and the foundation allows for periodic deliveries such as these to be made to different low income or needy health care centers or individuals. On this occasion, a delivery was made of wheelchairs, orthopedic supplies, gauze, bandages, immobilizers and other supplies to sports clubs and rehabilitation centers of San Bernardo which serve residents of the municipality free of charge. The beneficiaries were: Cyclo-cross Club, Athletics Club, Club de Pablo, Domus Foundation, Corporación Edudown, Boxing Club, Hockey Club, Soccer Club, Municipal heated pool and Gymnasium for senior citizens. Special thanks to our partner Charity Vision for all these donations.

In collaboration with the Ambassador of Cuba in Santiago Jorge Lamadrid Mascaro and the Commercial Attaché Sergio Espinosa, we were finally able to complete the paperwork and send a container of 450 wheelchairs to Cuba by ship.

The donation was subsidized by Smoky and Kimie Bayles, friends from the USA who have been supporting the Humanitarian Aid projects carried out by the FEDES Foundation for many years. One of their dreams—a dream that came true—was to be able to donate wheelchairs to Cuba. They would have liked to go personally and meet the people who were going to receive them, but due to circumstances beyond their control it was not possible, so Steven Colon and Grace Martin went to Cuba to accompany the distribution of the donation.

The San Juan de Dios Home for the Elderly cares for those with mental illnesses and physical disabilities in its two Centers.

It has one area for men and another for women. This place is run by brothers from the San Juan de Dios Order. The Center had a very big need for wheelchairs, and due to lack of resources they could not get more, so they had to share the few they had among the users, according to the mobilization needs. This meant that many elderly people could not go out for some fresh air or participate in general activities due to the lack of this equipment.







The Directors and professionals gave us a tour of the Center, together with the government health authorities.

Antonia, a wonderfully sweet woman, only had words of affection and gratitude.

Juan told Grace that he is a poet and singer; he sang some of his compositions. Grace listens to one of his poems. He was very happy to have someone listen to him; he was a school teacher. He suffers from osteoarthritis and loves to talk. He doesn't receive many visitors and was very happy that we visited him from so far away, especially that wheelchairs that they needed so much had been donated.

Meeting with Directors of Hospitals and Consultation Offices of the Fifth Region





A meeting was organized by **Dr. Juan José Mendoza Navarro, Director SSVQ (Servicio Salud Viña Quillota--Viña Quillota Health Service)**, who invited the Directors and Administrators of all the hospitals in the Region.

The meeting was attended by representatives of more than 10 hospitals. The purpose was to introduce them and encourage them to take advantage of the program "Help in equipment and clinical supplies" that the FEDES Foundation and its International Network are carrying out.







Second meeting at the San Juan de Dios de Los Andes Hospital

The Director of the San Juan de Dios de Los Andes Hospital, Jimmy Walker invited Directors and Mayors of his Region to a meeting with members of the FEDES Foundation, so that they could share the experiences and results of donations that the Foundation has brought about in terms of equipment and clinical supplies for hospitals and clinics in different regions of the country. This meeting was attended by representatives of the CESFAM (Centros de Salud Familiar—Family Health Centers) and authorities of the Municipality of Los Andes. Steven Colon shared with those present what these clinical donation programs consist of and presented the results of the agreement the with Quillota Hospital, where they have already benefited from these donations in supplies, surgical instruments and clinical equipment, for a value in Chile of approximately \$650,000,000 pesos (one million dollars aprox.). After this meeting, a collaboration agreement was signed between the San Juan de Dios Hospital and the FEDES Foundation.

Jimmy Walker, Director of the San Juan de Dios Hospital and his administrative team came to learn about the programs carried out by the FEDES Foundation. They are very interested in being able to renovate and equip the hospital with new technology and thus be able to provide all their users with better services.

Donation of wheelchairs, walkers and canes.

Lorena Vera paid us a visit. She works in the parliamentary office of Senator Felipe Harboe in the Ñuble Region. She wanted to know about the Foundation and see the work we do.

She was able to learn about the humanitarian aid programs that the Foundation carries out and visited the Foundation's Skills Training Center where we have classrooms for Culinary Arts, Complete Beauty Salon services, Computer Class rooms, Telecommunications, Care for the Sick, Computer Support, Wardrobe, and Warehouse and Logistics, among others.

She told us about the great need for Orthopedic Implements in the Region of Nuble, a Region with a large rural population. On this occasion she received a donation of wheelchairs, walkers, and canes to help the neediest in the Region.

SIX NEW COURSES BEGAN

All the courses described below pertain to the Skills Training Program of the National Training and Employment Service (SENCE--Servicio Nacional de Capacitación y Empleo). Each course is for 25 people, from 18 to 65 years of age.





Complete Beauty Salon Services

COMPLETE BEAUTY SALON SERVICES: There are 25 women in this course which has 510 chronological hours plus technical assistance of 2 months, with a subsidy for tools. It began on December 11, 2017 and will end on May 29, 2018. At the end of the course students will be able to offer a variety of beauty salon services (Facials, manicure and pedicure, massage therapy, hair removal, makeup, among others), providing quality services with a clear orientation towards customer service.

BAKERY, PASTRY AND CONFECTIONERY: There are 24 women and 1 man in this course which has a duration of 495 chronological hours plus technical assistance of 2 months, with a grant of equipment as to start their Micro Business. It began on December 27, 2017 and will end on June 7, 2018. At the end of the course the students will be in a position to properly carry out the functions and tasks of food handling, with special emphasis on the basics of baking, pastry and confectionery operations, applying norms of safety and risk prevention, along with proper customer service.







Administration

Care of the Sick

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: There are 22 women and 3 men in this course which has a duration of 545 chronological hours plus an internship of 360 hours. It began on December 11, 2017 and will end on June 7, 2018. At the end of the course students will be able to handle administrative office procedures, including the preparation of documents, document file management, customer service techniques, accounting operations in basic terms, assisting in the different processes that are required for accounting and taxation, use of different IT tools, according to the established requirements and protocols.

CARE FOR THE SICK: There are 24 women and 1 man in this course which has a duration of 500 chronological hours plus an internship of 360 hours. It began on December 11, 2017 and will end on May 25, 2018. At the end of the course the students will be able to carry out all the operations of basic care up to intensive care of patients and elderly people who are bedridden, using the necessary equipment and accessories, properly disposing of contaminated waste. All of the above with a clear ethical position, based on legal rights.



Computer Support



Telecommunications

COMPUTER SUPPORT: There are 7 women and 18 men in this course which has a duration of 530 chronological hours plus an internship of 360 hours. It began on December 18, 2017 and will end on June 11, 2018. At the end of the course students will be able to configure information systems, repair equipment and perform network installations and repairs for data transmission. In all of the above, observing personal security measures and taking care of the power supply systems or other communication networks with which the data networks usually share spaces.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS: There are 25 men in this course which has a duration of 450 chronological hours plus an internship of 360 hours. It began on December 11, 2017 and will end on May 10, 2018. At the end of the course students will be able to carry out all the installation and repair operations in the services of basic telephone, broadband internet, fiber optics and satellite television. All this in a framework of quality and with a clear orientation towards customer satisfaction.

Certification of the course "Production of Pastry and Confectionary Products" in collaboration with the PRODEMU Foundation.



This week the "Production of Pastry and Confectionary Products" course of 80 hours was certified for 15 women beneficiaries of the Program for the Development of Employability Skills of the PRODEMU Foundation.

It was attended by Práxedes Peña Reyes, Provincial Executive Director, Maipo Province, Metropolitan Region and the Metropolitan Regional Director Mrs. Evelyn Mierzejewski.







Beauty Fair








In May the Complete Beauty Salon Services students from the Skills Training program in our Work Training Center offered the services they learned during the course to the general public.

From 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., in the classrooms, they cared for about 100 people who paid an entry fee for

the following services:

- Manicure
- Pedicure
- Massages
- Make up
- Facial Cleansing



In this activity they put into practice everything they learned in the course.

These are: Complete Beauty Salon services, Sewing and Dressmaking, Care of the Sick, Bakery, Pastry and Confectionery and Installation and Repair of Telecommunications systems. 

TRAINING COURSES FOR WORK SECOND SEMESTER Skills Training and More Capable Programs

SKILLS TRAINING

The purpose of this Training Program is to generate work skills in its users that allow them to increase the probability of accessing jobs, based on the training received.

The final result it seeks is job placement for the beneficiaries within 3 months of completion of the training process.

Courses: "Warehouse and Logistics," "National and International Cuisine," "Elderly Care," "Installation and Repair of Telecommunications Systems."

MORE CAPABLE PROGRAM

Its objective is to support access to and permanence in the labor market for women, young people and disabled persons who are socially vulnerable, through technical training, transversal skills and labor mediation, enhancing their employability.

Courses given: "Assistance activities in the installation of telecommunications services," "Administrative logistics," "Activities of basic assistance in computer science," "Basic bakery operations," "Operational support in computer platforms," "Bartender"

Course in International Cuisine







During the training we received visits from several renowned restaurants, which offered practices to students with possible jobs. The good performance of all the users is worthy of mention, the majority of them being hired.

Telecommunications Courses









In these sequences we see the students with their instructor Rodrigo Sanchez. During the Telecommunications course the users learn technical skills including:

- Safety Protocols on the job
- Basic Telephone Installation Services,
- Internet and Broadband, together with Fiber Optic Technologies.
 They detect installation failures, connection using a multi-tester.
- They are taught how to install conduits according to safety regulations, applying protective elements during installation.



In theoretical classes with instructor Alberto Galvez, teaching technical skills in:

Reception of Products, Telephone and Broadband Service, Customer Service Protocols, Basic Electricity among many others.

Warehouse and Logistics Course





In this course, students are trained in Warehouse Management, Hygiene, Safety and Risk Prevention, Cargo Reception, Stock Control, Storage, Management of the SAP MM Material Management Module and Fork Lift Training. The companies "Imperial" and "Coasin," among others, visited during the course, and, after interviewing the users, they were pleasantly surprised by their extensive knowledge of logistics and how well prepared they were. Good performance by the female gender throughout the entire course should be noted in an area more customarily occupied by the male gender. After their internship, a large number of participants, especially women, have been hired.

Course in the Care of the Sick and the Elderly

Students learn techniques for identifying and checking on conditions and physical and cognitive functional pathologies of patients, communication and empathy in the care of people, vital signs and first aid, etc. This course has had very good results in the labor field. After the practice, a very high percentage are hired.

"The hand washing dance" is an activity that reinforces the importance of hand washing in the area of health in a recreational and entertaining way, while emphasizing participation and teamwork at the same time.





Transversal Skills Module

Methodology based on the experiential learning approach where each beneficiary plays an active role in their own learning. It is a process of continual discovery and growth, both personally and professionally, through their own experience.

Social and Occupational Support



The Social and Occupational Support (ASL–Apoyo Socio Laboral) component is a support resource for participants in the More Capable and Skills Training programs. This support is implemented during the entire period of the training course and internship (for courses with dependent endings). Through a continuous process of individual accompaniment and personalized attention, an orientation service is delivered, aimed at enhancing a person's job placement.

She was amazed when she heard them, because the majority of those present who had good entrepreneurial ventures had trained at the FEDES Foundation Vocational Training School. Immediately the Mayor asked her assistant to call Steven Colon to come participate in the event, saying affectionately: "This gringo is going to be as excited as I am to hear these testimonies and participate in the joys and achievements of the students of the Fedes Foundation."

The meeting went on for quite a while because the testimonies and experiences were very enriching. All of them are admirable women, worthy of praise and imitation. The ceremony also included the participation of the Hermanas Carmelitas Descalzas (Barefoot Carmelite Sisters).



Bartender Course Certification

The Bartender course corresponds to one of six awarded to the FEDES TRAINING FOUNDATION in the 1st Call for Bids in the SENCE More Capable Program. This course was held in the Municipality of Peñalolén, in "La Escuela" center; 23 people participated, including ladies and men from 18 to 36 years of age, ending with 22 students and the following benefits: Free course, materials and necessary supplies, mobilization and meal; child care subsidy for children under 6 years of age and subsidy for tools.



MANAGING DONATION OF CLINICAL INPUTS AND MEDICINES FOR THE REGION OF QUINTANA ROO - MEXICO.

FEDES Foundation is collaborating in the management of a project to help the Hospitals and Consultation Offices of the Region of Quintana Roo in Mexico with medicines and clinical supplies. In a visit to this Region, the Director of Health of the City of Puerto Morelos invited us to visit her Municipality where we saw the great need that exists in the area of health. We asked our partners in Chile, the American Organization "Direct Relief International" and its Manager in Mexico if they could help in this city, and to our surprise Mr. Eduardo Mendoza, Manager of DR in Mexico, offered to help the entire Region where there are 11 Hospitals and more than a hundred consultation offices. Sergio Chale, Legal Director of the Municipality with Dr. Noemi Rodriguez, Director of Health, After the tour of the district. They showed us the public consultation office that serves more than 30,000 people, where they do not even have 15% of the medicines they need, without mentioning the great lack of supplies they have.





The FEDES Foundation is invited every year to participate in the "Social Inclusion Fair" organized by the Office of Disability of the Municipality of San Bernardo, promoted by Mayoress Nora Cuevas. Many institutions that support and work on this issue participate. The Municipality provides a space and designates a stand for the Institutions that participate. The FEDES Foundation appreciates every opportunity to spread its program of donations of orthoses and other aid for the benefit of the most disadvantaged. It also disseminates all the courses of Training in Crafts that the Foundation carries out free of charge (with ENCE code) for people of limited resources.



Ninoska is 31 years old, born with the syndrome of Focomelia, a malformation of teratogenic origin consisting of the absence of bone and muscle elements in the upper and lower limbs. She lives with her mother. They are a very hard-working family with very scarce resources. Ninoska is applying for her own house, so she works hard to plasticize documents and ID cards at the doors of the Municipality of Pedro Aguirre Cerda. She is an example of overcoming, a single mother of a beautiful 5-year-old child that she adores. She told us: "I am very grateful for this donation, it has changed my life. I could not get out of the house because my son is a little restless and makes sudden moves; I have fallen many times from the conventional chair, trying to go after him. Now I can go to the park, I put him in the lower part of the chair where he can be supported. Another thing is that now I arrive at work clean, because before I used to get my hands very dirty. Thanks to the electric chair, now I have a new job as a municipal official in customer service. For me this chair is essential, I am very grateful. The electric chair has been the greatest gift. Thank you very much.

DONATION OF A WALKER

Jorge Cifuentes, four years ago he contracted a disease called Guillain Barre syndrome. He was left without full mobility in his body, was bedridden and barely able to speak. Three years ago, he was released from the rehabilitation sessions, being told that they could not do anything more, that these were the secuelae of the disease, and that he would have to live like this, with 100% disability, for the rest of his life. He told us in his few sentences that he can talk now: "I didn't give up and I just started doing the exercises they taught me. After three years I was able to get out of bed and walk short distances, holding on to different objects." I was very grateful for the donation of the walker. He went on: "Now with the walker I will be able to go for a walk, and my desire is to be able to go out and sell the few crafts that I have left. At this time, I cannot work with my hands (he is an artisan who works making silver jewelry), but I have faith that little by little I will regain the use of my hands." He began to practice with speed and the brakes right away; he was very happy ... we joked that now he had a Mercedes Benz.

A few days later he sent us this note: "I am writing to you, first thanking the Lord for allowing me to acquire a walker through you, on December 12 of this year. It has been spectacularly useful for me as a matter of fact, it has even served as a work tool, enabling me to be able to sell some small products and also walk great distances. I pray to God that He will bless you a lot in your work. of help. I say goodbye very gratefully (especially to Ms. Grace) Greetings."

They are neighbors of the Lo Espejo Municipality, near us. She arrived accompanied by her husband Luis Gabriel, who told us that he is very worried about Teresa. All these years he has helped her to get around. Gabriel wants her to learn to get around on her own, in case something happens to him. He commented with a bit of sadness: "I am not in good health either, I have had many brain and facial operations, since I suffered an accident as a child (a wagon ran over my head). It's a miracle that I survived, since the hospital in my Region did not have resources for good surgery. I can't see well either, but I manage. Teresa and I thank you for helping us because she needed a cane to go to their training classes for blind people. Infinite thanks, for making it possible!!"

DONATION OF WHEELCHAIRS

Irene, 52 years of age, suffers from severe rheumatoid arthritis, which affects all her joints. Fanny (Irene's daughter-in-law, who lives with her) called us on the phone to ask us for a chair for her mother-in-law. She commented: "My mother-in-law Irene is desperate because she has been going everywhere for a long time, knocking on doors of different government institutions but since she is not 60 years old, she is not eligible for the donation of a wheelchair. She has not been able to walk for years because of the pain; she spends a lot of time lying down, that's why she has had sores on her back and buttocks. To go to the doctor, she has to charitably request a neighbor to lend her one for a few hours. I need you to help us. I explained the donation program for these implements and the documentation that we request.

Not even two hours had passed when Fanny showed up with Irene (her mother-in-law) because she wanted us to meet her and see that she really needed the chair It took a big effort for Fanny to push a borrowed chair that was broken with wheels that did not move.

When we delivered it, they cried with emotion ... Fanny sighed and said, "not only is it a help for her; it is for me too. You can't imagine, I carry her everywhere ..."

Irene, nearly overcome with emotion, told us: "I want to get out of the house, I want to be able to go to the fair to help my family and not be a burden." When I asked her what her wish was, where would she like to go now that she has the chair? Looking at the sky and with a big smile she told us: "My biggest desire is to go for a walk with my grandchildren (Fanny's children who are 7-year-old twins) to the beach. With the chair it's easier for them to take me. That would make me very happy."

Nacho, 22 years old, happy with his wheelchair. Nacho's sister told her teacher at school that her brother did not have a wheelchair. They live in a rural area and his family finds it difficult to move. The teacher is the nephew of a friend who collaborates with the Foundation and told us about the situation of this family and offered to take the chair to the house. The whole family could not be happier. (She had outgrown the chair she had, which was donated by TELETON.)

Nacho no longer qualifies for the benefit of accessing another chair because he is 22 years old and the program is for up to age 18. He is a very happy young man who loves to go out for a walk. Now he can do it.
