Together with Nurse students who were so thankful and sent a special thanks to Charity Vision. They mentioned that they never had a chance to work with supplies like these that were so good and sophisticated, and make their job so easy.



In this rural area there is hardly any jobs, so most of the people work picking up Cheries that are exported to other countries. We visited Elia who is 80 years old, is blind her daughter Mirella who is 64 takes care of her full time and was so happy for the bed since, of her 8 other brothers and sister she is the only one who cares for Elia so it was imposible for her to buy a medical bed.

Berta Torres (lower picture), has Parkinson, the wife of her son takes care of her, she was so thankful and wanted us to see how well she takes care of her bed and that she keeps it tidy and clean.



Edith started to cry of happiness, she was telling us how thankful she was as to have an electric medical bed for her mother and how the bed has changed their life and is making it so much easier and comfortable. She makes bread and sells it in the community and with the money she makes is working hard as to fix the house so she can have a nicer place for her mother, we were able to get a donation for her as to buy more flour.



Monica Rojas, had a vascular accident. When we got to her house a neighbor was taking care of her because her son had to go out as to get her medicine, her neighbor Maria was telling us how Monica was always a great friend and always gave her a helping hand, and it was the least she could do, to take care of her when her son has to go to work or go out to do other shores.



Alan 17 years old, he suffered asfixia when he was born so is totally disable. His mother was so thankful and said it has been a blessing for both of us, it makes it a lot easier as to take care of him.

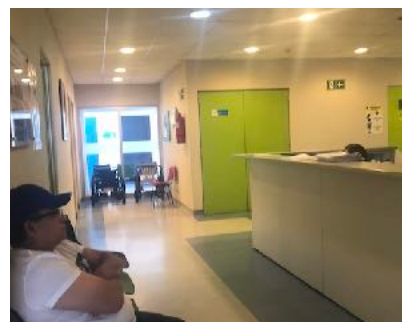

COMPUTER SUPPORT AND NETWORKS COURSE



The facilitator conducts theoretical classes for the development and formalization of concepts. It complements the learning process by presenting work, mainly to introduce the student to learning concepts and procedures. The expositions are applied to real life situations in order to determine the level of understanding reached by the student and the deepening of these concepts and procedures (scope, conclusions) during learning. In addition, research work will be carried out on the history of ISe, suggesting the implementation of group training activities in order to enrich the analysis, the foundation and the discussion. In addition, the facilitator must motivate and encourage the participation of the students with presentations and debates around the topics covered in the classes.



Learning practical modules

The practical classes based on problem solving seeks to develop the student's capacities for reflection and active participation in the learning process. On the other hand, problem-based learning allows both the rapporteur and the students to identify learning needs, share information, and complement their knowledge.



Our students in class activity. This course finished during the Pandemic, but thank God we were able to get jobs for most of them who are still working.

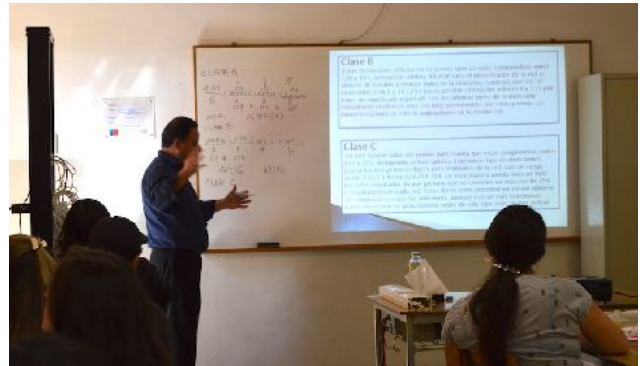


IT Support and Computer Networks, course completion

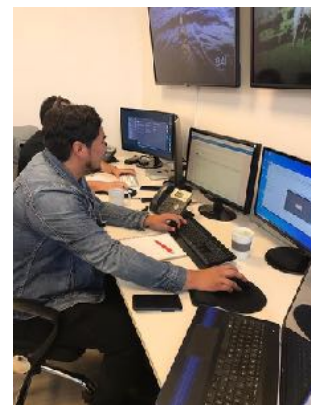
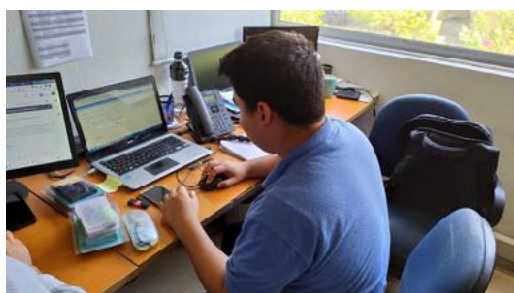


Graduates of this course may work as assistants to computer technicians or even as technicians in small entities.

They will be able to configure information systems, repair equipment, and perform data transmission network installations and repairs.

Clothing Course for the Manufacture of Workwear and Clothing in General



At the end of the course the participants have learned:

- To take, record measurements and determine female, male and child sizes, depending on the garment to be made.
- Identify the materials and tools necessary for the cutting and assembly of fabrics, applying occupational safety measures.
- Organize the production of work clothes within the established period according to the technical specifications of the garment to be made.
- Calculate the costs associated with making garments.
- Identify personal skills for entrepreneurship.
- Identify personal resources to create and manage a business. Generate cash flow sheets necessary to keep your business running, as well as the necessary skills for this same purpose.
- Establish sales strategies to increase business income and entrepreneurial skills to sell, Computer skills, and more.

Donation of Medical Supplies - From **Direct Relief International** destined for Copiapo in the North of Chile.



Fedes makes a donation delivery with collaboration of Rotary Club Copiapó Oriente, Punta of Cooper S.A. societies and Contractual Mining Carola. These Companies helped with all local operational cost and transport. More than 200,000 dollars in medical supplies were donated by Direct Relief International and Fedes to the Salvador Allende Family Health Center (Cesfam) of Tierra Amarilla and the medical school of the University of Atacama (UDA).



The donation will be divided into two parts; one of them will go to a Public Health Center and the other to the UDA Faculty of Medicine, whose students will use the medical supplies both in academic practices and in the new health Center they have now inside the educational campus, and which serves vulnerable populations free of charge. The Director of the UDA University, Mr. Celso Arias Mora, and Carlos Bravo from the health Center thanked the alliance that allowed the delivery of the donation because "the university, in its health career, needs many supplies that are quite expensive to be able to do internships and attend the poor communities.

She was able to share all of our programs and they decided that because Chile already has 20% of the Population that has some kind of disability that they will like to participate in the Wheel Chair program.

Constanza Chirinos from ProLife and Carolina Rodriguez from Metlife and Cahuala Consultants decided to sponsor and activity as to distribute 170 wheel chairs. One of the ideas was that their personal could participate assembling the wheel chairs and also making the distribution. And the activity was geared as to help the Elderly in need.

We had a meeting at FEDES School as to review the program and the organization of all the activities and also had a training time on how to assemble the wheel chairs with The Directors and other employees. The Companies sponsored all the expenses of all the activities.

Fernando Morgado, 75 years old, was accompanied by the psychologist Manuel Riquelme from the Home for Homeless people Refugio del Buen Pastor, who asked us for a wheelchair for Mr. Fernando who suffers from severe osteoarthritis in the knee and has the onset of Alzheimer's. The foundation picked him up from the streets and gave him shelter. All his life he worked as a truck loader until he suffered the abandonment of his home, which led him to a street situation and a lot of suffering. Now, at the Home he feels happy and well cared for.
